Pumpkin, Scissors, Tape, Knife, and Pen or Thumbtack

Get Started



Print your stencil on 8.5 x 11 paper and cut away excess paper.



Using the point of a pen or a thumbtack, punch holes through the paper along the outline of the stencil. When finished, remove the paper and tape.



Place your newly carved pumpkin in a cool spot, and use LEDs or tea lights to bring it to life!




Tape your image where you'd like it to appear on the pumpkin.



Using a knife or similar sharp object, carefully cut along dotted lines.

What You'll Need

Get Started



Print your stencil on 8.5 x 11 paper and cut away excess paper.



Using the point of a pen or a thumbtack, punch holes through the paper along the outline of the stencil. When finished, remove the paper and tape.



Place your newly carved pumpkin in a cool spot, and use LEDs or tea lights to bring it to life!



Tape your image where you'd like it to appear on the pumpkin.



Using the Laminate Cutter, scrape the pumpkin skin away between the dotted lines. Avoid punching completely through the pumpkin wall.






Using a knife or similar sharp object, carefully cut along dotted lines.

Cow Spots

What you'll need

Pumpkin, scissors, tape, knife, thumbtack, marker, laminate cutter

Get started



Print your stencil on 8.5 x 11 inch paper and cut around the cow spots.



Tape on the spots in whatever arrangement you like. No two cows are the same!



If you have an empty spot, you can draw on your own shapes as well.



Use a thumbtack to poke holes in the pumpkin along the outline of the spots.



Using the holes to guide you, carefully carve the pumpkin skin out of the spot outlines using your laminate cutter. Make sure not to carve too deeply or you'll puncture the pumpkin.



Use LED or tea lights to bring your cow spotted pumpkin to life.
